

Little Furry Thing



You can make the Little Furry Thing out of any fun fur, plush or pompon yarn. You can make any size you like.

I knitted the fun yarn with a much smaller needle to get a compact and windtight fur.



The Little Furry Thing is started on a neck tip. It is closed on the side of the neck with a button closure. It warms the throat and the breast but isn't thick in the neck part.




How long the breast triangle becomes, depends on the yarn you use.

Material:

Ca. 100 g of fun fur, plush or pompon yarn
 Circular knitting needle 30" long, 1-2 needle sizes smaller than recommended for the yarn
 Crochet hook in the same size
 2 flat buttons (that won't feel uncomfortable!)

My Little Furry Thing for kids is made of Red Heart Pomp-a-Doodle (100% Polyester, 54yds/100g with needle US8, I knitted up 100 g), my Little Furry Thing for adults is made of ICE Smooth Fur (100% Polyamid, 97yds/100g with needle US6, I needed 60 g).

Construction:



The Little Furry Thing is started on a tip of the triangle. It later becomes one of the neck tips. It is completely knitted in garter stitch.

With every RS row, you make a kfb increase on the right edge. The right edge of the triangle is the neck edge. When it is long enough to reach around the neck in a leger way, the Little Furry Thing is finished.

Instructions:

Cast on 3 stitches, knit the WS row.

Attach a marker to mark the front side / right side of the knitting. In every RS row you make a kfb increase on the right edge: Knit the first stitch but leave it on the left needle. Knit the stitch again through the back loop and let it slip.

Make a kfb increase on the first stitch of every first row (RS row). Knit all stitches on the WS row.



When the triangle is large enough so that the neck edge can be wrapped around the neck in a leger way, make a button hole on the right edge before casting off: crochet a few chain stitches and fasten them to the first knitting stitch with a slip stitch for the button hole loop.

Then cast off all stitches loosely. I did a crochet cast off with a crocheted chain stitch between each stitch.

Sew the buttons to the other end of the neck line: One button will close the Little Furry Thing quite tight to your neck, the other one will close it loosely.

Sew in the yarn ends. If you like, you can brush up the fun fur or pull the pompons to the right side.
